
How lovely it has been this week to finally get some better weather and to see everyone enjoying being outside more!





CLASS NEWS

Class 1

Class 1 have been busy writing their own Lost and Found stories. They have included expanded noun phrases and included conjunctions in their sentences. We have been learning about o'clock, quarter past/to, half past and the time to the nearest 5 minutes in maths. We have been looking at the work of different artists who paint flora and fauna. Class 1 drew what they saw in the artwork. Their drawings were excellent. In computing we have looked at the work of Georges Seurat. He is a pointillist artist, using the drawing program Class 1 created sunflowers using dots of different sizes and shades of colour. We had the most wonderful weather for our cross-country event on Wednesday. Class 1 all tried really hard. Congratulations to Rowan for winning the Yr 2 boys race and to Arthur for coming third. Let's hope the sun is here to stay, we are all enjoying it!

Class 2

Class 2 have been working on expanded noun phrases and similes in Literacy as part of their work on The Eye of the Wolf by Daniel Pennac. They used their similes to begin a description of the wolf. Rebecca and Hattie worked together to produce a lovely piece of writing. In maths they have been looking at the commutativity of multiplication and ways to multiply three numbers. Our Plant classification work started with C2 predicting how plants could be classified. We had ideas ranging from root sizes to rare or common plants. Y2 were fabulous at their Cross Country event this week whilst Y3/4 are all progressing nicely with their swimming and badminton skills at William Brookes. What a great week C2.

It has been a busy couple of weeks in Class 3 with a focus on our Year 6 pupils as they have been preparing for the SATs national assessments which begin on Monday. 
