Mrs Hunt



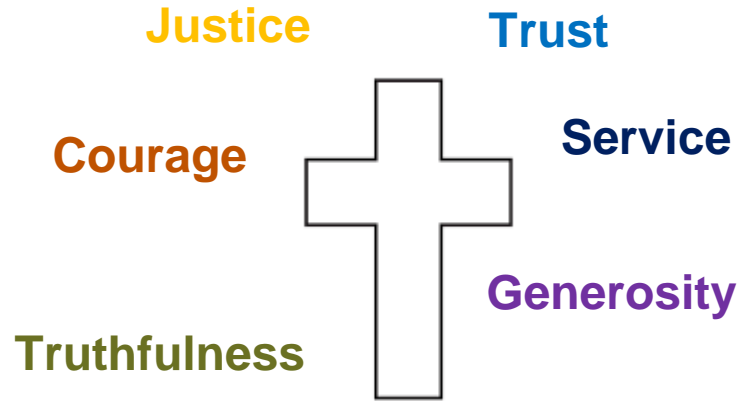
Welcome back everyone to the summer term – though as I was scraping ice off my windscreen earlier this week I did wonder if warmer weather will ever return!

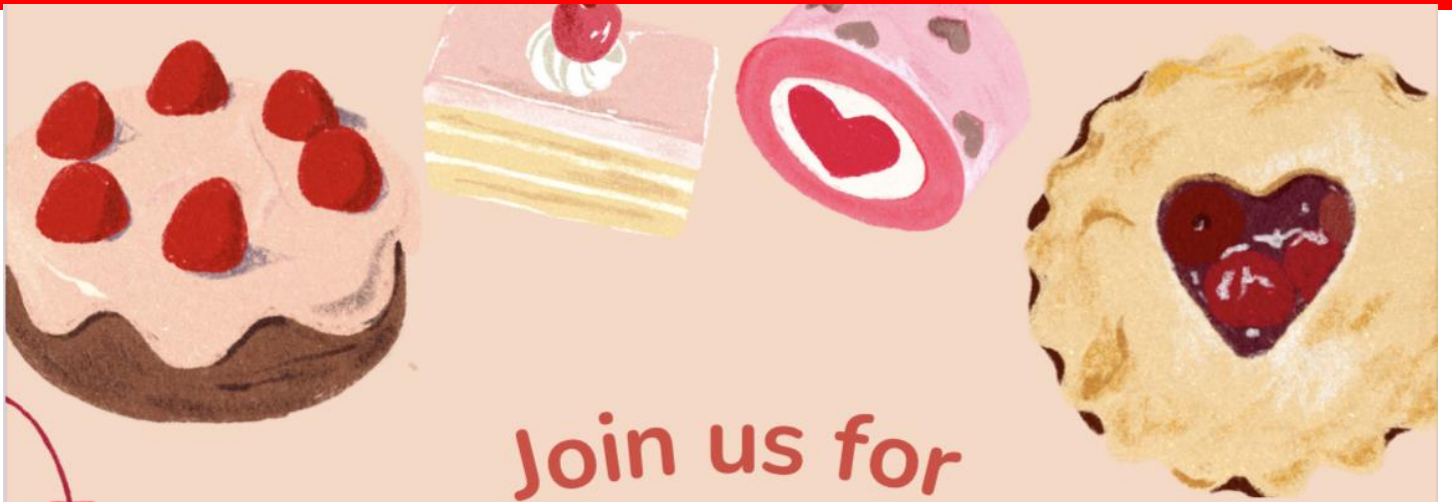

Class 1

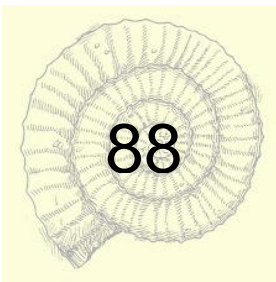
Class 1 have had an amazing start to the Summer Term! They are all trying so hard! We have been reading the book 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. Their written work has been fabulous. We have been learning about apostrophes, verbs and suffixes in grammar. The children have been learning about multiplication and division this week. We have been thinking about how we can use a beaded line to help us with our calculations. We have started a unit on sculpture, the children have been introduced to a variety of different sculptures and tried to draw them. In computing we have been looking at the work of different artists and then created our own versions using the paint programs. We have been thinking about special places and then looked at different places of worship. Keep up the hard work Class 1!

Class 2

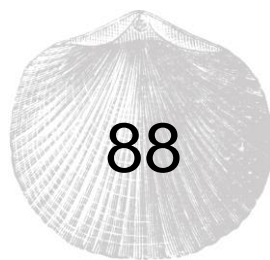
C2 have started their new unit of Literacy work about the book Journey by Aaron Becker. Today we looked at irregular and regular verbs and practised how they are spelt. In maths Y3/4 are expanding their knowledge of Addition and Subtraction by estimating the answer before we solve the actual question. Y2 are adding and subtracting pairs of two-digit numbers. We are learning about the beautiful landscapes of our national parks in Geography. This week we are researching the differences between the Peak District and Lake District. We were lucky enough to have Mrs Benbow visit and use her Godly play to extend our knowledge of the events leading up to Pentecost. In Science we have looked at Classification of different species of plants. We have been busy!

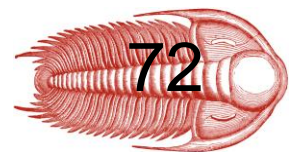

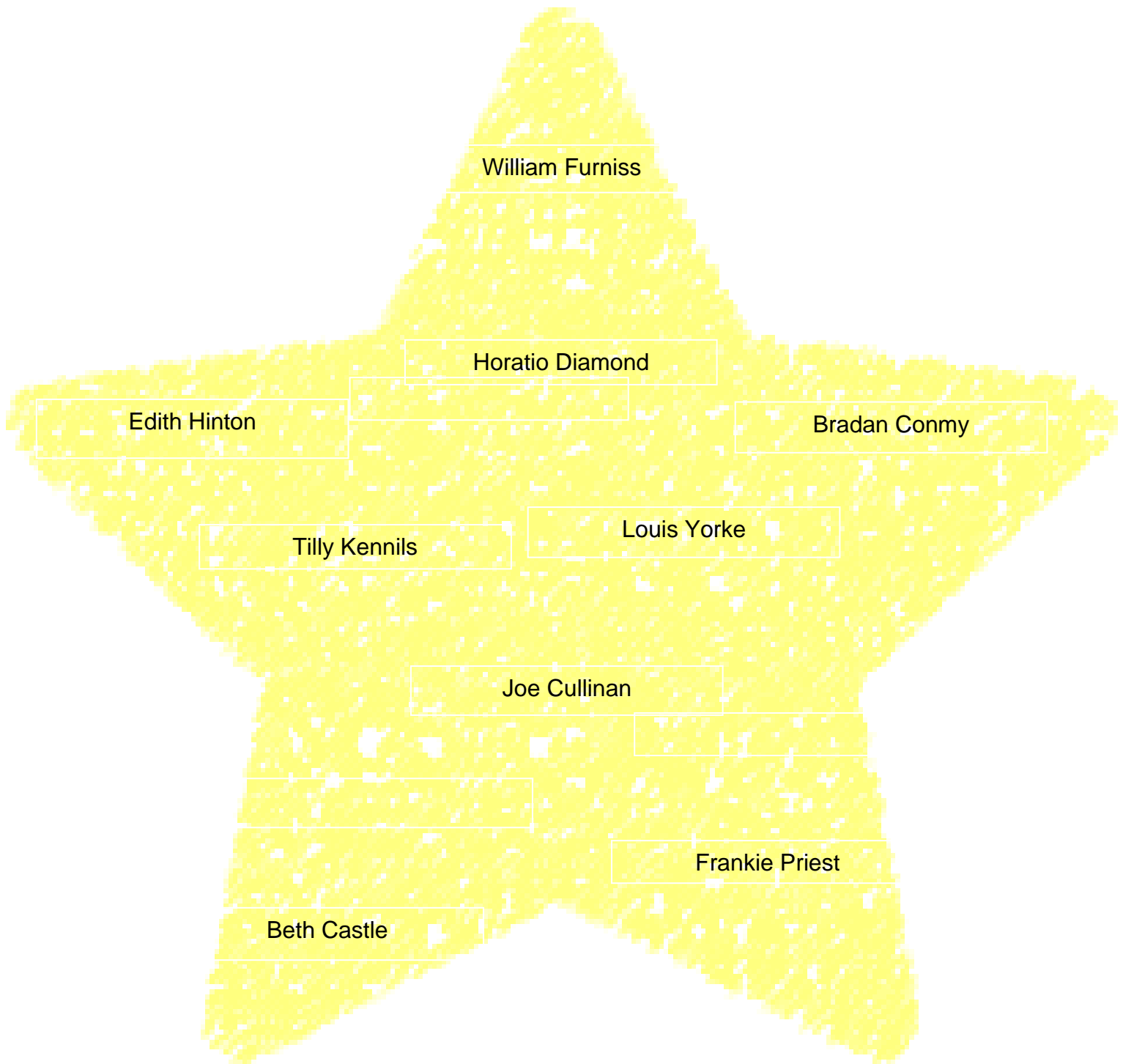
Class 3

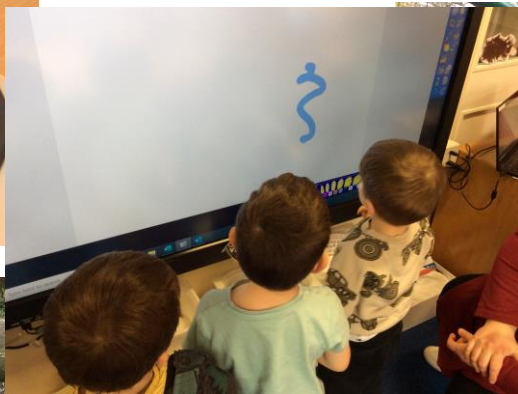
What the nursery has been up to...
